The following is a list of goals ASUN has set, and the progress it has made.

- 1. Continue commitment to diversity issues through sponsored events and increased communication with the campus community.**  
—ASUN sponsored Monday's presentation by diversity speaker Marlon Smith. The speech, which drew an estimated audience of more than 2,000 people, was called a "huge success" by ASUN President Curt Ruwe.
- 2. Improve interaction among campus student governing bodies: ASUN, the Residence Hall Association, Interfraternity Council and the Panhellenic Council.**  
—All governing bodies are working with homecoming activities, Ruwe said. First Vice President Amy Payer said residence hall participation with homecoming activities had risen this year.
- 3. Work for the implementation of a parking class.**  
—Members of the Campus Life Committee met with Tad McDowell, manager of University of Nebraska-Lincoln Parking and Transit Services last week. Their proposal will be presented to the Parking Advisory Council Tuesday. Ruwe said a parking class could be initiated by the beginning of the next school year.
- 4. Address pedestrian safety concerns in the 14th and Vine streets area.**  
—ASUN will meet with the Lincoln mayor's office Oct. 24 where senators will present their case for increasing pedestrian safety on campus. ASUN is searching for testimonials from people who have been hit or otherwise affected by the dangerous traffic around Henszik Hall or the Campus Recreation Center.
- 5. Work to seek more student input in the student fee allocation process.**  
—New members of the Committee for Fees Allocation have been going through an orientation process with Kendall Swenson, chairman of the committee. Swenson also attended the UNL Diversity Retreat, where he sought student input regarding the fees allocation process, Ruwe said.
- 6. Lobby for the university to continue research to develop a fall break policy.**  
—The Student Impact Team is gathering student opinion regarding a fall break. Ruwe said a proposal would be presented to the administration in a few weeks.
- 7. Work toward a regents' bylaw change to allow student organizations to apply for funds from the University Program Council once every two years rather than once every four.**  
—Ruwe said ASUN passed a bill in support of allowing organizations to be funded more often. The funding change will be voted on by the NU Board of Regents Friday. Ruwe said the bylaw change had the support of student affairs officers from all NU system schools. The support could mean the bylaw change had a good chance of being passed by the regents, Ruwe said.
- 8. Research advising policies on campus and gather student input in order to look for ways that advising can best serve student needs.**  
—Academic Committee Chairman Erik Hoegemeyer had at least one survey from each college, Ruwe said. Hoegemeyer will continue to gather student opinion on advising, which will be a semester-long project, Ruwe said.
- 9. More efficiently inform students of services that ASUN provides and what it accomplishes for students.**  
—Ruwe said ASUN had been promoting student government by planning homecoming activities this week.
- 10. Successfully create a more integrated campus community through the implementation of the Student Impact Team and the University Leadership Community.**  
—The University Leadership Community will meet Tuesday, where members will discuss "breaking down barriers," Ruwe said. He said members of all student organizations were invited to attend the ULC, which will meet in the Nebraska Union.
