
"It's something most of us don't notice," Cornell said. "We turn a blind eye to it. But people are noticing us; people are staring."

Students Tuesday slowed to look at the huts, structures patched together with cardboard and duct tape bearing written messages such as "If you think it's cold today, try living like this all year."


Chris Stone, a sophomore dietetics major, Habitat for Humanity member and Shantytown project coordinator, said the project's goal was to show UNL students they could make a difference.

Signs posted on the huts note that if each UNL student contributed one dollar, Habitat for Humanity would have enough money to build a house for a needy family.

SANDY SUMMERS/DN SIGNS OUTSIDE the Habitat for Humanity shack ask for donations to its cause.




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












