BOULDER, Colo. - With a season-ending loss to Nebraska. Colorado finished with a losing record for the first time since 1984 and will not qualify for a bowl game

for the first time in 10 years. But not all was lost for the Buffaloes (5-6 overall and 3-5 in the Big 12 Conference), who rekindled their rivalry with the Cornhuskers,

losing just 27-24. The 21 seniors who were playing their last game for Colorado left

Folsom Field on a positive note. "It took a game like Nebraska to get the meanness and the attitudes out," CU senior receiver Chris Anderson said. "We should have done that eight games ago.

"I feel like the younger guys are going to step it up. They were able to witness a season of ups and downs."

Though Colorado Coach Rick Neuheisel said he was satisfied with his team's performance Friday, the game was similar to the Buffaloes' entire season.

'Basically, it was who we've been all year," Neuheisel said. "Part of the time we executed terrifically and part of the time we didn't. And that's the

with a 5-6 year."

A lack of talent had nothing to do with the Buffaloes sub-par season, senior quarterback John Hessler said.

"This is a damn good football team," Hessler said. "We just didn't live up to expectations.'

Despite the loss, Hessler said, he was satisfied with his final game at Colorado. One offensive pass interference call with under a minute remaining, he said, was the difference in the game.

The Buffaloes pulled together in the fourth quarter and backed by a recovered onside kick, CU rallied from a 27-10 deficit to score twice in the final four minutes of the game. Colorado's second onside kick failed, but the Buffalo defense stopped reason we find ourselves finishing Nebraska in three plays and forced

the Huskers to punt with one minute remaining in the game.

Beginning from its own 20-yard line, Colorado began a drive that had the potential to save its season.

Hessler completed a pass to senior receiver Phil Savoy for 16 yards before throwing two incomplete passes. Facing a third-and-10 situation at the CU 36, Hessler hit Savoy at midfield, but Savoy was called for offensive pass interference.

Though Neuheisel said it probably was interference, most CU players disagreed with the call, including Savoy.

'That's just the way I play," Savoy said. "I like to play aggressive and use
