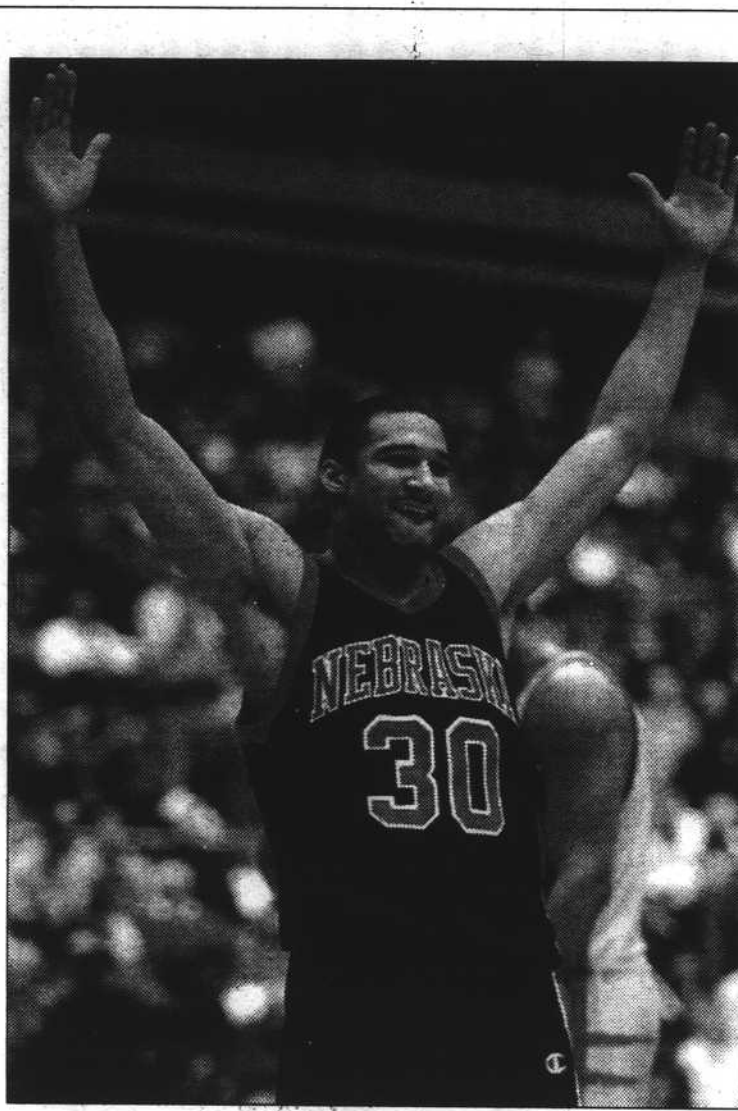

point until the 5:47 mark of the first half. Lue was 2 for 8 from the field in the first half, but the Huskers still led 31-29.

In the second half, Lue caught fire and hit on all nine shots and matched his career high with nine assists.

"In the first half, I tried to pass to get the team involved," Lue said. "But in the second half, coach said I've got to look to score and take over the game."

As a team, the Huskers shot 58 percent from the field, their second-best performance of the season.

Defensively, without its main stopper Florence, the Huskers limited the Cyclones to 42 percent shooting from the field. ISU fell to 12-17 overall and 5-11 in the conference.

The Huskers also lost the services of Hamilton with just under three minutes in the game as he too went down with a sprained ankle with the Huskers leading 61-55.

"There's a war going on out there, and we had to participate in it, because Iowa State's in our path into getting into the NCAA Tournament," Belcher said.

The Huskers have a first-round bye in the Big 12 Tournament and will play the winner of the Baylor-Texas A&M game Friday.

Weekend Wrap-Up

Swimmers place second
The Nebraska men's swimming and diving team finished second at last weekend's Big 12 Championships in College Station, Texas.

No. 3 Texas blew the competition away, finishing with 886 points. The No. 15 Cornhuskers were next with 638½ points.

Junior Valery Kalmikovs led NU on Saturday, winning the 200-yard breast-stroke with an NCAA provisional-qualifying-mark time of 1 minute, 59.21 seconds. All-American sophomore Adam Pine placed third in the 100-yard freestyle with a time of 44.17 seconds.

NU ends trip with shutout
The Nebraska baseball team ended its six-game road trip on a good note defeating Toledo 11-0 Sunday afternoon at Cardinal Stadium in Louisville, Ky.

The Cornhuskers finished the trip with a 4-2 mark and improved their overall record to 7-5.

NU was led Sunday by sophomore Ken Harvey who blasted a three-run homer, his fourth overall, in the first inning. Harvey finished the game 3 for 5 with 5 RBIs and two runs scored.

Starting pitcher Pete Lythgoe earned his first victory of the year, as five Husker pitchers combined to shut out the Rockets.

The Huskers tossed two shutouts over the weekend and also blanked Louisville 1-0 Friday.

Sophomore Chad Wiles (2-0) threw a complete-game shutout and struck out four, while scattering six hits.

"All of our pitchers did an excellent job throwing strikes and keeping us in the games all weekend," NU Head Coach Dave Van Horn said.

The Huskers travel to Waco, Texas, next weekend to open Big 12 Conference play against Baylor.

With the team trailing by two goals, forward Kim Engesser scored Nebraska's first goal of the spring. Lauren Tatum and Jenny Benson added goals to give the Huskers a 3-2 lead. Lindsay Eddleman provided NU's fourth goal, setting the stage for Morneau.

Nebraska will travel to Clemson, S.C., March 12 to face the U.S. Under-20 National Team.

NU wins three in Phoenix
With three wins last weekend in Phoenix, Ariz., the Nebraska men's tennis team improved to 8-2.

The Cornhuskers defeated Weber State 7-0 Friday, Northern Arizona 7-1 Saturday and Indiana State 6-1 Sunday.

NU returns home to play Kansas at 2 p.m. Friday.

Huskers fall to Texas Tech
The Nebraska women's tennis team fell 5-4 to Texas Tech Sunday at the Woods Tennis Center.

The 67th-ranked Cornhuskers, who had won five of their last six matches, fell to 5-3 overall and 0-2 in the Big 12 Conference.

NU senior Lisa Hart improved to 6-2 on the season with a 6-3, 6-4 victory over Amanda Earhart. Senior Adriana Dulic posted NU's only other singles win for Nebraska.

"We were out completely today," NU Coach Scott Jacobson said. "We had chances to win at No. 1 and No. 5 singles, but lost the third set in both matches. We need to win those matches to be competitive."
