## NU plans to put 6-2 offense to use


'We will use it situationally but never for a whole game," Pettit said. "And it's good for several reasons. You can catch a team off balance if they're expecting

us to run a 5-1. Or if teams see early in the season that we're prepared to run the 6-2, that means they have to spend extra time preparing for two offenses."

A 6-2 switch could initially confuse teams, because it is rarely seen at the Division I level. Of the top 25-caliber programs across the country, Brigham Young is one of few teams that run the double-setter offense.

The primary setter is always the setter in the back row. The setter in the front row becomes a right-side hitter. In a true 6-2, the roles switch after three rotations. The front-row setter moves to the back and becomes the primary setter. The back-row setter moves to the front and becomes the secdary setter and right-

The Nebraska volleyball team plans to to experiment with a 6 - 2 offensive scheme this season after using primarily a 5 - 1 last season.



When the ball crosses the net and the Huskers move into their offensive set, the back row setter moves to the net and become the primary "quarterback". The front row setter transitions to the 10 ft line and is available to either set or attack from the right side. The setters share du In a true 6 - 2 each setter sets for 3 rotations each.



Just like the 6-2, the sette moves to the net to run the offensive scheme. But instead of placing a secondary setter on the court, a right side hitter is available. The setter sets for 6 rotations.
