Zimmer runs for self, excels for Nebraska

"I decided either I'm not going to run anymore, or I'm just going to run for myself," Zimmer said. "I didn't listen to what everyone was saying, and I think that was a lot healthier."

A freshman again, this time on the Nebraska women's cross country team, Zimmer vows she will not let other people's expectations affect her and her running abilities.

Zimmer said she learned during her sophomore year of high school that the past cannot repeat itself. "My sophomore year was a bad year," Zimmer said. "People expected all of these great things from me, and I couldn't deal with that."

And even though Zimmer doesn't want to deal with people's expectations while at NU, she knows those expectations are part of being a collegiate athlete.

"Jeannette is pretty advanced for a freshman," NU Cross Country Coach Jay Dirksen said. "She has made a good transition to college running."

That easy transition has helped Zimmer in her first three meets as a Cornhusker. She led the Husker women in each of those meets and earned an individual victory at the Bearcat Classic in Maryville, Mo., Sept. 5.

Because of her early success, Zimmer said she already is facing expectations.

But this time, Zimmer is pre-

pared for those expectations.

"I let people have the expectations they are going to have," Zimmer said. "But I'm just going to run for myself and see what happens."

"In the past, expectations meant everything to me. Now, they don't mean a lot."

Dirksen said Zimmer possesses a strong work ethic and shows self-discipline. He knows her will and dedication will help her deal with the pressures of collegiate athletics.

"Jeannette shows a lot of commitment in whatever she does," Dirksen said. "She has adjusted to college well."

Zimmer is confident, too. She knows she has learned how to deal with expectations.

"I do things for myself now," Zimmer said. "You can't expect the past to repeat itself. It's never going to happen. You have to create things for yourself."

North Division's strong showing pleases Solich

over rival Iowa last month is an important step for the Cyclones.

"I thought it was very good for their program and very good for our conference," Solich said.

Every North Division member has caused a stir with at least one impressive performance.

Kansas (2-3 and 0-3) nearly upset Big 12 South favorite Texas A&M last Saturday in a 24 - 21 defeat.

Missouri entered halftime against No. 1 Ohio State leading 14-13 in a pre-season game in Columbus, Ohio. Missouri lost 35-14.

No. 15 Colorado surprised highly touted rival Colorado State with a convincing beating to open their season.

No. 5 Kansas State has impressed, despite a controversial preseason schedule, by averaging more than 60 points per game.

Nebraska throttled then-No. 7 Washington 55-7.

The Big 12 North thus far has the best combined record (21-7) of any major college conference or division.

Colorado Coach Rick Neuheisel said the competitive division reflects college football as a whole this season.

"People thought we beat a lesser team in Fresno State," he said. "But they turned around and beat BYU who beat Arizona State."

"You better strap it on every week."

Snyder, whose Wildcats play Colorado this week, agrees with the assessment.

"You'd be foolish to feel comfortable," he said. "Anybody can beat anybody."

The Nebraska women's basketball team will get increased television exposure this season, as the Cornhuskers are slated to play three games on Fox Sports Net in 1999.

NU's first televised game will be its Big 12 conference opener against Missouri on Jan. 3, at the Bob Devaney Sports Center. The game will be televised at 2 p.m.

Home games with Oklahoma on Jan. 30 and Iowa State on Feb. 7 will be televised by the network at 3 p.m.

The Huskers also have an expanded contract with the Nebraska ETV Network, which will televise five games this season, starting with the CableVision Classic on Nov. 13 and Nov. 15.

KOLN/KGIN-TV (Channel 10/11) will televise a Dec. 12 game against Montana. It is slated to start at 7:05 p.m. at the Bob Devaney Sports Center.
