# Beloved' explores terror of slavery

The physical and emotional scars of slavery have been addressed many a time in modern cinema, but few films delve into the spiritual aspects as much as Touchstone Pictures' latest release, "Beloved."

knowledge of her gestures, speaking style and facial expressions, connections between Sethe and Winfrey would be easy to spot. Nevertheless, Winfrey delivers a solid, believable performance and never strays from her character's innate mannerisms.

Glover also does a fine job in his portrayal as the kind-hearted yet dimwitted Paul D. Though not a huge




