UNMC names chancellor Maurer, a former college dean in Virginia, appointed

The appointment of the future chancellor of the University of Nebraska Medical Center was part of a third-grade current events report in Tampa, Fla., on Monday.

After Harold Maurer, who will start the top post Dec. 1, mailed an Omaha World-Herald article on his appointment to his daughters in Tampa, his 8-year-old granddaughter, Diana, presented it to her class, he said.

NU President Dennis Smith made the original presentation, naming Maurer, who has been the dean of the UNMC College of Medicine since 1993, the center's new chancellor subject to approval by the NU Board of Regents at its Friday meeting.

Maurer worked at the Children's Medical Center at the Medical College of Virginia in Richmond, Va., for 13 years, and he has served as the Chief of Pediatrics for the U.S. Public Health Service Hospital in Norfolk,
