Lincoln student senate postponed a bylaw change Wednesday that would return control over officer appointments to the University Program

make sure all student organizations are properly funded and have the right to direct their funds in a manner they choose. This includes choosing an executive board to make funding decisions, he said.

"(CFA) believes direct control of any organization is wrong," Schreier said. "That is not how student government works."

Gaffney said she is pleased a compromise between the two student organizations is in the works.

"This is something that really means a lot to UPC," Gaffney said.

Schreier and Gaffney will propose an amendment to the bylaw change to ASUN on Wednesday.


