Other than possibly "There's Something About Mary," this is the funniest movie of the past year. Unlike "Mary," however, "Waking Ned Devine" utilizes strange twists in the story line to get the jokes across, which keeps the film flowing quickly through the latter parts of the picture.

While there is the share of solid performances, it is mainly the wellwritten plot by writer/director Kirk


Joining Danza in the run of "The Iceman Cometh" will be Kevin Spacey, who appeared in the play's London productions. The play opens in April.
