Students who wish to vote by absentee ballot must complete 'Form L' (available through ASUN Director of Development, 115 Nebraska Union, between the hours of 9 am and 5 pm). Student's signature must be notarized and the ballot must be cast on or before 4 pm on Tuesday, March 2, 1999.

Students so disabled shall call the ASUN Director of Development at 472-2581 on or before noon on election day, March 3, 1999, and arrangements will be made for voting.
