enough," Walker said. "We'll see if that can help us come NCAA tourna-

This season the Huskers, ranked eighth in the NSCAA poll, are not short on talent. NU returns eight starters from last year's 17-4-1 team. Three All-Americans dot the Husker

Senior Lindsay Eddleman, the leading returning scorer from last season, may be expected to provide the offensive spark furnished last year by Kim Engesser, who scored a team-record 27 goals.

But Walker said he is not necessarily looking for a player to fill in where Engesser left off.

"A more likely scenario is you'll see more balance in an attacking standpoint," Walker said. "I don't expect any drop-off in offensive pro-

The defensive side of the field has All-Americans as well. Seniors Isabelle Morneau and Sharolta Nonen spent the summer playing for the Canadian national team in the Women's World Cup. Joining them in the World Cup was junior Karina LeBlanc, who is back for her second

Also returning is junior Jenny Benson. The Huntington Beach, Calif., native spent all of last year on the bench with a knee injury.

Now, the former All-Big 12 player will be back on the field.
