you in so many ways."

"Eric Crouch is one of the best option quarterbacks that I have ever seen," Brown said. "In addition, Dan Alexander is running over everybody; I think he had over 150 yards against Colorado in the first half on Friday.

'Tracey Wistrom, their tight end, caught a lot of balls against us the last time, and Matt Davison is a great receiver. We can't look at trying to

defend them right now because it would probably scare us to death. Instead, we have to look at what we have to get fixed."

One thing Texas doesn't need to fix is its defensive line, Solich said.

"They not only played strong against us, but they really have played strong against everybody they've played," Solich said. "Their two interior guys are great football players. But the rush ends are excellent, too. All of them have size, speed and strength.

With the kind of strength they have up front, that is why teams have had trouble doing things consistently against them. You try to run the ball on first down, and you get 1 or 2 yards."

The key for Solich will be to find a balanced offensive attack to keep those four linemen out of the back-
