ond turning car. The woman rolled over on top of her daughter to protect her as they were struck by the car, Duckworth said.

The two were dragged 14 feet by the car, but they escaped the accident with minor injuries. The woman was treated at BryanLGH West Medical Center, 2300 S. 16th St., for minor back injuries, and her daughter was treated for a head laceration, Duckworth said.

The driver of the car, Kara Meusch, 19, a student at Nebraska Wesleyan University, was cited for failure to yield.

Police: Man arrested for alleged child abuse

Doctors treating a 3-year-old boy Monday for a broken arm in a bicycle accident noticed injuries not consistent with most bicycle-related injuries, Duckworth said.

The doctors at St. Elizabeth Regional Medical Center, 555 S. 70th St., found multiple bruises on the boy's body that they didn't believe were a result of the accident, Duckworth said.

When asked where the bruises came from, the boy told doctors he had been struck by a shoe, a book and a hand, all by his mother's boyfriend, Jeremy Fenstemaker, 24, 7000 Thurston St., Duckworth said.

Fenstemaker' was arrested Monday for child abuse, a class four felony.
