Exhibition to showcase, select creations of student designers

Each spring, the University of Nebraska-Lincoln textiles, clothing and design department offers Lincoln residents a fresh look at fashion and artistic interpretation of textiles.

The "Juried Student Exhibition," held in the Robert Hillestad Textiles Gallery, runs until May 3 and features the works of UNL students.

More than just an exhibit, however, the "Juried Student Exhibition" is a testament to each designer's skill, as the pieces for the show were chosen by judges from outside the textiles department.

"It's an honor to be included in this show," said Wendy Weiss, the gallery's director. "We didn't provide quotas for the jurors, so it's really a reflection of the jurors' choice."

Each year the department selects one new judge to work with a judge from the previous year. This year's judges were Anne Pagel, director of the Haydon Gallery, and Kate Brooke, president-elect of the Nebraska Women's Caucus for Art. The two selected 35 pieces by 18 students from a group of 59 entries.

Weiss said the jurors had four categories to use when picking each piece: creativity, composition, work-

manship, merit or relevance.

For Mel Barger, a student included in the exhibition, the show offers something different for students.

"It's a great opportunity for undergrad and graduate students to show their peers what they can do and show the community what they can do," she said. "Seeing the previous exhibit in the past couple of years, I was amazed by what the upper class had been doing, and I wanted to be a part of that."

She also said that not only was it a good opportunity to show work to people outside of the textiles department, it was an opportunity to have work selected and judged by people living and working in Lincoln's art community.

"It's better because our instructors have seen us progress with our work," Barger said. "Outside judges don't know who did what and how they

came about it, it's just the end result."

Carla Coorts, a student also represented in the show, agreed with Barger.
