Looking For Graduate Student To Serve As An Advisor In Residence For A UNL Fraternity

University of Nebraska Fraternity is looking for a male graduate student with background in education and/or leadership development to serve as a live-in advisor. Position would include academic counseling and program development as well as leadership, ethics, values and conflict resolution education for the membership and support for executive officers in areas of rule enforcement. Position would work in conjunction with House Parent and would report directly to Alumni Advisor(s) and National Fraternity Office.
