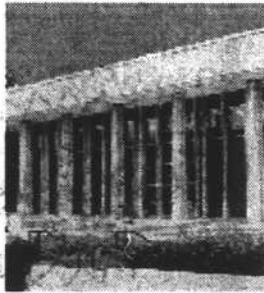

Big brown building brings Broadway, bands to Lincoln

ers and tried to appeal to a broad base of people.

In an attempt to attract even larger audiences, he said more Broadway and celebrity performers have been invited to perform on the Lied Stage.

Performers who stuck out in Bethea's mind included Elizabeth Streb, who he said will provide a very unique style of dance and extraordinary technical agility.

He also noted several artists who are new to the Lied stage, including Ravi Shankar and his daughter Anoushka.

Shankar has been playing

traditional Indian music mixed into a Western pop sound for half a century.

Bethea also mentioned Buddy Big Mountain, an American Indian puppeteer, ventriloquist and storyteller, as another newcomer who can be enjoyed by the entire family.

In October, Joan Baez, a major part of the musical and social revolution in the 1960s, will bring her folk-music sounds to the Lied stage, bringing baby-boomers in the audience back to
