For four days in June, the University of Nebraska-Lincoln will become home for some of the Midwest's brightest students.

The colloquium is an opportunity to show off UNL to some of the regions brightest students by bringing faculty and prospective students together, said Annie Magnusson, assistant director of honors recruitment.
