Less Than Jake hits Omaha stage

The band, which has been touring all summer. will perform at the Ranch Bowl tonight.

Less Than Jake has always tried to make its music as accessible as possible.

Whether that means playing an early, all-ages show or taking a little less at the door to keep tickets prices down, the band has worked hard to get its music to the widest possible audience.

The band, which originated in Gainsville, Fla., brings its ska/punk sound, a strong following and a talented lineup of openers to Omaha's Ranch Bowl tonight for an all-ages show, making the \$12 ticket price a great value.

Less Than Jake has a prolific library of music, including six full length albums - the last two on Capitol Records.

While those compact discs sold well, "Losing Streak," released in 1998, sold more than 200,000 copies.

Less Than Jake has decided to leave the world of big-business music and return to a smaller. artist-friendly label.

The band will be previewing many of the songs for its next album, **"Borders** and Boundaries."

Less Than Jake is now searching for a new label to release the CD. Punk label Fat Wreck Chords is reportedly the front-runner.

Less Than Jake, which prefers to handle its own business affairs, wanted more say-so in the day-to-day operations of the band - something that is nearly impossible at a major label. An independent label would allow them to keep more control.

Less Than Jake has been touring solidly for the entire summer. They played four shows in early August as part of the Vans Warped Tour and will continue to tour into the fall.

Opening the show will be Suicide Machines, One Man Army and Pollen.

Suicide Machines, who released their third album on Hollywood Records in March, also played some Warped Tour dates with Less Than Jake in August.

then just stay up and head straight to teach my 8 a.m. class," she said.

Mamiya not only rewrote chapters, but selected photos and provided input on design, production and color accuracy.

She also provided input on the book's Web site, pronunciation guide, instructor's manual and color slides.

"The scope of the text itself is about as comprehensive as you can get," Mamiya said. "But the publication project was even more overwhelming. This book has over 1,400 illustrations and a greater percentage of those in color than any other art history textbook.'

The book has two parts: prehistory through the medieval period and Renaissance to the present.

Specializing in Roman art, Fred S. Kleiner, a professor of art history and archaeology at Boston University, wrote the first half; Mamiya, who specializes in modern and contemporary art, wrote the second half.

Daniel portrayed young David in a recent BBC adaptation of "David Copperfield." He also appears in the upcoming John Boorman movie "The Tailor of Panama."


Director Chris Columbus and producer David Heyman said Monday they also have cast two British newcomers to play Harry's best friends. Ten-year-old Emma Watson will play Hermione Granger and 11-year-old Rupert Grint will play Ron Weasley.

The casting call for Harry and other characters from J.K. Rowling's best-selling books had children from Britain and elsewhere sending in audition tapes to Warner Bros.

"We saw so many enormously talented kids in the search for Harry," Columbus said in an announcement on Warner's Harry Potter Web site. "The process was intense and there were times when we felt we would never find an individual who embodied the complex spirit and depth of Harry Potter. Then, Dan walked into the room and we all knew we had found Harry.

The Potter books follow the exploits of an 11-year-old boy who discovers he inherited magical powers from his parents, a pair of wizards killed by a powerful enemy

"Having seen Dan Radcliffe's screen test, I don't think Chris Columbus could have found a better Harry," Rowling said in Warner's announcement.

NEWYORK-Summer reality series "Survivor" and "Big Brother" helped CBS squeak into the ratings top spot last week, according to Nielsen Media **Research** figures released Tuesday.

"Survivor," the week's toprated show, was seen by 28.7 million viewers. The live Wednesday edition of "Big Brother" ranked fifth with 17.0 million viewers.

The top 10 parsed out largely as it has for much of the summer: CBS' reality shows plus ABC's "Who Wants to be a Millionaire," plus three newsmagazines and two scripted series: ABC's "The Practice" and CBS' "Everybody Loves Raymond."

Overall in prime time, CBS led the week with an average of 8.98 million viewers (a 6.3 rating and an 11 share), followed close behind by ABC with 8.91 million viewers (6.1 household rating, 11 share).

In third place, NBC had 7.94 million viewers (5.6 rating, 10 share).

Fox had 6.37 million viewers (4.2 rating, 8 share). UPN had 3.57 million viewers (2.2, 4), the WB had 2.35 million viewers (1.6, 3), and Pax TV had 1.38 million wers (1.1, 2).

In the evening news race, NBC's "Nightly News" won with 9.65 million viewers (7.1 house-

hold rating, 16 share). ABC's "World News Tonight" had 8.20 million viewers (6.1 rat-ing, 14 share), while "The CBS Evening News" had 7.56 million viewers (5.8 rating, 13 share). A rating point represents

1,008,000 households, or 1 per-cent of the nation's estimated 100.8 million TV homes. The share is the percentage of in-use elevisions tuned to a given show.






