

# Swimmer threatens DN with libel lawsuit at meeting coaches attend

Swimmer Sara Jowsey attended the Daily Nebraskan Publications Board meeting on Wednesday, bringing with her an entourage of swimming coaches. Jowsey leveled charges against the Daily Nebraskan, saying the newspaper misquot-

ed her in an Oct. 2 story on alleged swim coach wrongdoing. The Publications Board sets policy for the newspaper. Accompanying Jowsey to the meeting were Swimming Coach Cal Bentz and Assistant Coaches Keith Moore, Kelly Nordell and Rick Paine. None of the coaches com-

mented during the meeting, but instead several women, including Bentz's wife, Cara Anderson, a research associate in Family and Consumer Sciences, took the role as Jowsey's spokeswomen. Contacted by the Daily Nebraskan on Wednesday evening, Anderson refused to

identify the other women present at the meeting, saying they were simply friends of Jowsey. Jowsey said the Daily Nebraskan took her quotes out of context and fabricated other quotes. The newspaper ran a clarification Oct. 3, stating some quotes of Jowsey were taken out

of context, but Jowsey said she was not satisfied with its length or page two placement. She said she wanted other accommodations to be made or she would sue the newspaper. Daily Nebraskan Editor Sarah Baker defended the newspaper's actions, saying it followed standard procedures in

clarifying Jowsey's statements. The board recommended the newspaper allow Jowsey to write a letter to the editor and consider writing a story including Jowsey's opinions. The board's recommendations are not binding, though, and the final decision rests with Baker.

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
