Winkle said arranging for Spade's performance has been a learning experience that will help the Homecoming Committee in the future.


Because of this gained knowledge, Winkle said she hoped next year the committee could bring another big-name performer.

College Bowl is a competition in which teams of four, plus one alternate compete against other teams is a test of trivia knowledge.




