An exchange says: The students of Amherst are making a fight for the abolishing of compulsory chapel. The college senate recently unanimously adopted a resolution asking the faculty to abolish compulsory worship. The resolutions were vetoed by the president, Prof. Bates.

Prof. Fossler spent two days last week visiting the German department of the University of Kansas. He reports that he had a very pleasant visit. On being asked how the U. of N. compared with the U. of K., he replied that he was satisfied with the work we were doing.

Two important amendments to the Palladian constitution have recently been made. One makes it possible for students of the College of Law to gain admission to the society. The other admits as active members students taking graduate work in the University.
