## EDITORIAL.

Be sure to register. All students that wish to vote at the coming election must register. You may do so on any Tuesday before election. Show some interest in politics. Don't be a clam.

On Saturday evening, October 8, the University Debating Club assembled in Chapel. Future financiers aired their opinions and, after a lively discussion of nearly two hours, decided negatively on the resolution, "That national banks should be abolished." Political parties will take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

The University Debating Club was organized in the spring of '92. Its purpose is to supplement the work of the various society debating clubs. Experience has shown that, in the various debating clubs, membership is not large enough nor interest strong enough to insure invariably a good debate. Many students, too, belong to no literary society; hence, do not feel themselves at liberty to participate in the debate of the society clubs. To obviate these difficulties and to offer to every student that cares to avail himself of it, the opportunity to become a practical debater, the University Club was organized. Certainly no one will question its desirability.

On Friday evening, October 7, a meeting was held in Room 17, and a new literary society organized with fourteen charter members. A constitution was adopted and other business transacted. It was decided, until further arrangements could be made, to hold weekly meetings in Room 7. Membership, which is, for the present, limited
