Howard Addresses the Faculty Meeting.

Last Saturday evening at Chancellor MacLean's home, Prof. Geo. E. Howard addressed the University faculty on the subject of Leland Stanford University.

Stanford University, said Professor Howard, is really the product of one man. Its president, Dr. Jordan, having made a study of educational institutions, had worked out some theories which he was ready to put into practice in this new and yet great university of the west. Faculty meetings are held but twice a year; yet this does not signify that the faculty takes no part in the government of the institution. There are faculty committees as in the University of Nebraska, each having its specific work.

Another noteworthy feature was in connection with the relations between students and faculty. Each student, on entering, is required to choose a department in which he will take most of his work, and it is really the professor at the head of that department, rather than merely the subject he teaches,

who is elected. It then becomes the privilege of that student to confer with the professor whom he has chosen upon subjects concerning his university course. Each professor, then, has an oversight of the work of those students who have elected him, and it becomes his duty to advise and assist them. Occasionally a student, after being there for a time, desires to change to another department. This is permitted after certain form has been carried out.

An opportunity was offered for members of the faculty to ask questions of Professor Howard, and it was taken advantage of very promptly.

Y. M. C. A.

The Y. M. C. A. meeting Sunday afternoon was held in Delian hall. Rev. Dunning delivered an address on the study of the bible. A regular four year course of Bible Study will be opened soon. The officers of the association, have this in charge and arrangements for taking up the work may be made by consulting them.
