C. A. Ferrell, who is now professor of modern languages in Henry College, Texas, expects to return to Lincoln in the spring to take his advanced degree.

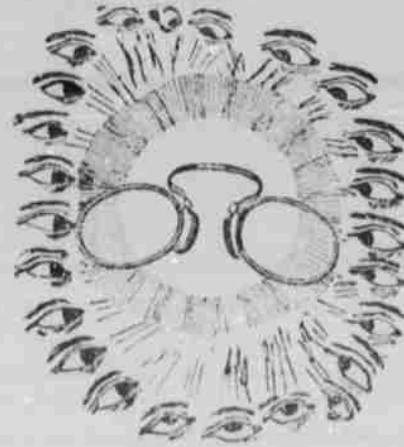
A. B. Wells, commonly called "Dutch," who has been very prominent in University athletics the past two years, has been appointed lieutenant in the United States regular army.
