DEBATING ASSOCIATION MEETS. The debating association met in the nounced at $1: 30$ oclock as an large attendance, much enthus'asm was manlfested, It was clearly the pre vailing sentiment that some changes vailing sentiment that some changes
must be made in order to hold two in-ter-state debates here this year and still maintain the financial standing of the association. The secretary was instructed not to reg'ster old members who refuse to pay the assessment made at the end of last year. President Craft announced that the assoclation had repaid E. F. Warner all the funds had repaid E. F. Warner all the funds
advanced by him last year. The association is out of debt, with the exception of two loans made by individuals, amounding to $\$ 8$. The association resolved itself into a committee of the whole to devise means for conducting the preliminaries this year. This committee recommended that a fee of $\$ 1$ be charged each contestant in the preliminaries; that but one prellminary be held this year; that one set of Judges act for all the sections in these contests; that the debaters in the preliminaries be divided into three sections, the whole series of debates to occupy three hundred minutes for the three sections, the time to be divided proportionately among the debaters. The rules were suspended and the report adopted.
A motion carred which instructed the secretary not to canvass for regis tration. A notice is to be posted immediately announcing that registration is open and it will remain open until 6 oclock in the evening of November 10 .
