This college was opened in 1883, and is now in vigorous operation. The University with its collections and the capital city with its public institutions offer special facilities and inducements to medical students. No fees are charged beyond the matriculation fee of \$5, and the actual cost of material for the study of Practical Anatomy

is paid board in the city at \$3 a week; furnished room \$3 to \$6 a month. Students of the Industrial College live on the farm, where board is furnished at cost. No charges for tuition, except matriculation fee of \$5. Students residing in the state, or persons about to enter the University, are allowed half fare in going to and from home by the railroads entering Lincoln.
