SESSION OF 1886-7.

The twenty-ninth Annual Course of instruction will begin the last week in September 1886 and close in March 1887. The course of instruction is graded, students being divided into first, second and third year classes. Qualifications for admission are either a degree of A. B., a certificate of a reputable academy, a teacher's certificate, or a preliminary examination.

The method of instruction is conspicuously practical, and is applied in the wards of the Mercy, St. Luke's and Michael Reese Hospitals daily at the bedside of the sick, and in the South Side dispensary attached to the College, where from nine to ten thousand patients are annually treated. Fees: Matriculation, \$5. Lectures, first and second years, each \$75. Demonstrator including material \$10. Laboratory \$5, Breakeage (returnable) \$5. Hospitals: Mercy \$6, St. Luke's \$5, or second and third year students. Final examination \$30.
