DARING ATTEMPT AT BANK ROBBERY.

Narrow Escape of Officer & Pusey's Bank at Council Bluffs. Yesterday at 12:30 o'clock, a most daring but unsuccessful attempt at bank robbery was made at Council Bluffs. An unknown man entered the bank of Officer & Pusey, while Mr. Pusey was there alone, the chief clerk being absent in Minnesota, said to him, 'You take money on time deposits here, I want to deposit a certain amount and wish you to figure up the interest for a certain time.'

THE KETCHAM CASE.

The Motion for an Arrest of Judgment overruled. The District Court of Douglas county met yesterday morning, Judge Lake presiding. SA. FRANCISCO, July 27. A dispatch from Durica to-night says the loss by the flood was one hundred and fifty thousand dollars. The Eureka Consolidated Mining Company losses twenty thousand. They will have to shut down their furnaces. Several more bodies have been recovered. A private dispatch from Eureka to-night states that fourteen dead bodies have been recovered. John Calvin, of York, shot near Carson City, Nev., this afternoon, causing great destruction of property. No lives were lost. The loss by the flood in Eureka looks up over hundred thousand dollars. In addition to the names given this morning the following are sent to-night, as drowned: Jim Smith, W. J. McGeary and Jas. Smith. At Anaheim, in this State, today, Constable Dye Davis tried to arrest Joseph Moreno on a charge of Mrs. Edridge. Moreno drew a pistol. Davis shot him near the heart. Moreno ran. Davis shot again and killed him. Moreno's first wife was killed by the same bullet with an ease that seemed to take from his difficulty.
