Articles of Incorporation of the Millard Farmers' Club. Article I. The name of this club shall be the Millard Farmers' Club.

Article II. The principal place of business of this club shall be at Millard station, county of Douglas, Nebraska.

Article III. The general nature of business to be transacted by this club is to conduct a voluntary society for the promotion of business and other entertainments of a social character.

Article IV. The amount of capital stock of this club shall be two thousand dollars, divided into shares of one dollar each, which shall be paid in the manner prescribed by the directors.

Article V. This club shall endeavor to transact business and exercise its corporate powers the 25th day of October, 1881, and its powers shall cease on the 25th day of October, 1882.

Article VI. The highest amount of liability or indebtedness, which this club shall at any one time subject itself, shall be three hundred dollars.

Article VII. The officers of this club shall be elected by a ballot, to be conducted by a board of three directors, who shall be elected from among the stockholders, and they shall appoint a president and such other officers as by law is required.

On this 29th day of October, A. D. 1881, personally appeared before me, Charles Schroeder, a notary public for the county of Douglas, Nebraska, Julius Schroeder, J. Blum, Claus Schumann, W. Gerloff, to me known to be the signers of the foregoing articles of incorporation, and acknowledged the same to be their voluntary act and deed.
