Correspondence of The Bee: REPUBLICAN VALLEY, February 8.—Indianola, twenty-two miles east of Culbertson, was for some time the end of the Republican Valley railway and a very bright town of about three hundred people has grown up and become well established.

A NEW BRAKE.

Successful Test on the Heavy Grades of a Mountain Railroad.

A new automatic brake was tested last week on one of the mountain roads of Colorado. The great advantage claimed for the brake is that it will overcome the terrible accidents which happen almost daily on the heavy grades in the mountains where the trains are liable to break in two get from under the control of employees. The test was made on a down grade, train running at a speed of twenty-five miles an hour. The engine was cut loose and the brake adjusted, stopping the train at double its length. The brake was attached only to one car of the train, and its quick and effective work fulfilled all promises of the inventor, Mr. J. F. Mallinckrodt. The brake is operated by compressed air or hand. It is attached directly to the truck beam by strong bell crank levers, the shoes striking the wheel inside. The added weight of a loaded car increases the pressure on the brake when applied. The relative lengths of the short arms of the bell cranks to the long arms determines the proportion of the weight transmitted to the brake. Experience has proved that a brake pressure equivalent to one-third of the weight of the car body and its load is sufficient for stopping a train on the heaviest mountain grades, consequently, if the short arms of the bell cranks are to be long arms in the proportion of 1.3, then one-third of the weight of the car body and its load will be transmitted to the brake shoes.

To set the brake again if previously released by hand, all that is necessary is to kick out the pawl of the ratchet holding the hand wheel. If compressed air is used to keep off the brakes, all that is necessary to set them, is for the engineer to draw off the compressed air from the pipe extending underneath the train. The conductor can set the brakes from any point of the train in case of necessity or danger, by simply pulling a cord attached to valves that will allow the escape of the air pressure. Should a train break in two, that act will allow the escape of the air pressure used in keeping off the brakes, and the result is an instant stopping of the entire train, no matter whether going up a mountain or down.

Steady and Permanent Growth of Stromsburg.

Correspondence of The Bee: STROMSBURG, Neb., February 5.—It has been unusually quiet in our town the past few days on account of the drop in the corn market or the rise in freight according to the new theory what the traffic will bear. There is still a large amount of corn and wheat to be marketed yet in Polk county. Never in the history of our county has prosperity been showered on our little town as it has in the past six months. Our burg has almost doubled in population since last September, and still the sound of the hammer and saw can be heard daily. Among the most prominent buildings in process of erection is the wagon and carriage factory of Mr. Olaf Headstrom. In connection with the main building he is erecting a tower for a wind mill with a thirty-foot wheel, from which he expects to obtain the necessary power required for all practical purposes. Mr. Headstrom is one of our most enterprising citizens and a first-class machinist. He thoroughly understands his business and will make a success of the enterprise.

A steam flouring mill, costing not less than \$10,000, is one of the probabilities of the near future. A proposition was made to our citizens a few days ago which will in all probability be accepted when it will only be a question of time when this greatly needed enterprise will be a reality. Several brick business houses and a town hall are among the improvements contemplated for the coming season.

Several persons who are prominently connected with the O. & R. V. railroad have invested in town lots and buildings have been erected on a portion of them.

Mr. Scott, from Lincoln, is now putting a large stock of dry goods and notions in the postoffice building. Mr. Scott has traveled extensively throughout the middle and western portion of this State and has wisely concluded that the little town on the Blue is second to none for a business location to any town in Central Nebraska, and the

as will be seen by the following report of shipments and receipts for the year 1881:

Number of cars of grain shipped 60, wheat 120, household goods 2, oats 20, machinery 1, broom corn 52, flax 5, potatoes 1, barley 2, corn 107, rye 7, merchandise 30; total, 427.

Number of cars received, sheep 1, sale 3, farm machinery 4, line 4, (private) coal (hari) 2, lumber 83, coal (privat) 78, coal (company) 172, emigrant goods 6, merchandise, oil, groceries, agricultural implements, etc., 318; total, 607.

It will be seen by the above statement that this station forwarded 204 more and received 158 more cars than Osceola did during the year 1881. The total shipments and receipts at Stromsburg and 1,094 cars, and at Osceola 739, making a total of 362 cars in favor of the little town on the Blue.

The following number of cars have been forwarded from this place since January 1, 1882: Corn 183 cars, oats 4, hogs 4, wheat 15; total, 207. HAWKEYE.
