I fully appreciate the gift as not only intrinsically valuable but for the flattering terms in which it has been pre sented to me. I accept your gift and the kind expressions of good-will which you so touchingly and feelingly express, and so long as life lasts shall retain it as a souvenir of the estimation which the members of the senate

have placed upon my poor services as one of their subordinate officers, and, when death shall still my heart's last emotion, I shall transmit unimpaired not only the token, but the kind and graceful expressions of your feelings accompanying the rift, tomy children's children, to the latest generation. Permit me, in this connection, to recall some reminiscences of the senate and its presiding officers in the past. When Martin Van Buren was vice president he was possessed gold snuff-box. He gave it to me in charge, to keep well-filled with souff, and see that it was placed on the vice president's table every day that the senate was in session. At the end of every week thereafter he handed me 50 cents to pay for the snuff. When his term expired I gave him the snuff-box. He left the city soon after, and forgot to give me the 50 cents that he had always given me at the sould feel the city soon after. at the end of each week. Henry Clay was very fond of a pinch of snuff, and enjoyed it much. He would often stop in the midst of a speech and call a page to bring him a pinch of snuff, and if he could not see any one of the pages he would leave his seat and walk up to the vice president's table, take up the gold snuff-box, take a pinch, and, returning to his seat, resume his speech. 
