I am very desirous of carrying the two candidates through, and, of course, shall do all I can to do so. The fight will be the Sixth and Fourth. Pritchett is managing the whole business, and I am keeping out of the city as much as possible. Cowell still working on the reservoir and getting ready for pipe laying on Monday or Wednesday as the case may be. I shall keep a bright look out, and after the republican primaries are over Shelby,
