FINANCIAL.

The stock market to-day was moderately active, the sales aggregating 350,000 shares. At the opening a firm tone prevailed and prices advanced 1/2 per cent, but this was subsequently lost, and the market became weak and continued to decline up to second call, when the lowest prices of the day, and in some cases of the season, were current. New Jersey Central was the weakest stock and dropped 5/8 per cent. Lake Shore, Denver & Rio Grande, Reading, Western Union, Louisville & Nashville, Michigan Central, and New York Central were also conspicuous in the decline. In the last hour, however, there was a firmer tone and a rally of 1/4 per cent. from the lowest point, the latter in Reading. New Jersey Central was an exception, and closed at the lowest point.

Events of the week in financial circles were important, chiefly for the renewed depression on part of the list. Money was easy throughout the week, the rates for call loans ranging from 2 to 4 per cent.

Foreign exchanges ruled steady until near the close, when there was a firmer feeling and a fractional advance in rates. Government bonds were active, especially for the 4's, which advanced over 1 per cent.

Railway and miscellaneous speculations were depressed almost throughout the week, with a very strong bearish feeling at intervals. At the lowest point the market showed a decline for unusually active stocks of 1/4 to 7/8 per cent., with the greatest fall in New Jersey, Wabash, Lake Shore, Missouri Pacific, and Denver & Rio Grande.

COMMERCIAL.

Omaha Wholesale Market.

The wholesale trade in most lines for the past week is reported as fair and prices well maintained. Grain receipts have been fair for the season, and higher prices have prevailed, closing as follows over this time last week:

Wheat, No. 2 advanced 1/2c; No. 3 advanced 7/8c; rejected advanced 1/2c. Barley, No. 2 advanced 3/8c; No. 3 advanced 1/2c. Rye advanced 1/4c. Oats advanced 1/4c. Corn shows a decline of 1/2c. Flour and Meal—A moderate movement has been reported, and the better grades are quoted at advanced prices, though operations have been somewhat impeded by the confident views of holders in anticipation of higher prices.

Chopped feed, corn and bran, is still scarce and advanced in price. We quote to-day, \$1.50, \$1.40 and \$1.15 per hundred with an upward tendency.

Trade in cattle is reported as fair. Receipts during the week, 30 cars, and advanced prices have been maintained. Hog receipts are good for the season. Packers report some sixty cars during the week at \$5.45@6.00.

Provisions—A moderate business has been done. Prices firm, with an upward tendency. Dried beef advanced 2/3c. Produce—Receipts have been liberal, while only a moderate movement in the way of sales is reported.

Potatoes—Receipts are heavy and prices declining; car lots have been sold as low as \$1.00. Eggs are in good supply at 10 1/2@11c. Butter—Receipts fair and prices weak, though all choice lots find ready sale at quotations on local account.

Fruits and green vegetables are in good supply, and quite an active trade is reported at former prices. The only changes reported in market to-day are as follows: Wheat declined 1/2c. Rye declined 1/4c. Corn declined 1/2c. Oats declined 1/4c. Potatoes declined 5@10c. Glycerine declined 5c.
