The twenty-ninth annual convention of the diocese of Iowa opened yesterday morning in St. Paul's church in this city.

Morning prayer was said by the Rev. Mr. Cunningham.

The ante-communion service was said by Bishop Perry, the epistle being read by the Rev. S. Ringgold.

The convention sermon was preached by the Rev. Canon Sprague, from St. Mark's gospel, sixth chapter, sixth verse.

The holy communion was then celebrated by Bishop Perry, assisted by Rev. Mr. Webb, and the offertory was donated to the fund for the support of postulants and candidates for holy orders.
