

NEBRASKA NOTES.

Religious. The Presbyterian church at Burdick was dedicated on the 2d. The Episcopalians of Harva are about to begin the erection of a church. The Catholics of North Platte closed a very successful fair last Saturday. The Methodists of Nebraska are arranging for a fair at some future time. The plans for the new Congregational church at Winona have been received. Sabbath school was organized at Peach Grove, Sully county, on the 21st. The Platteville-Telegraph says there is some talk of building a new church at Sidney. The Congregational church at Harvard, just deeded, is said to be one of the most neat and handsomest in the state. The colored glass for the windows of the Blue Springs Presbyterian church has arrived and the building is much improved thereby. The Baptists of Alexandria contemplate improving their church building by papering it and hanging shutters on the windows. The chandelier in the Fremont Catholic church fell on the evening of the 29th just before it was time to light it. The damage was slight, but it necessitated dismissal of the congregation. Rev. J. H. and Mrs. Worley, of Palmyra, are preparing to leave for China soon, where they will serve for one year in a missionary field. They expect to sail from San Francisco on the 1st of August. Rev. Mr. Kimball, state organizer in Nebraska for the Lutheran church, was in the city last week looking into the interests of that denomination here. 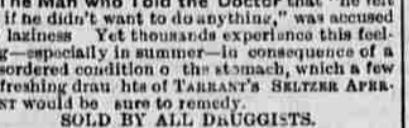
