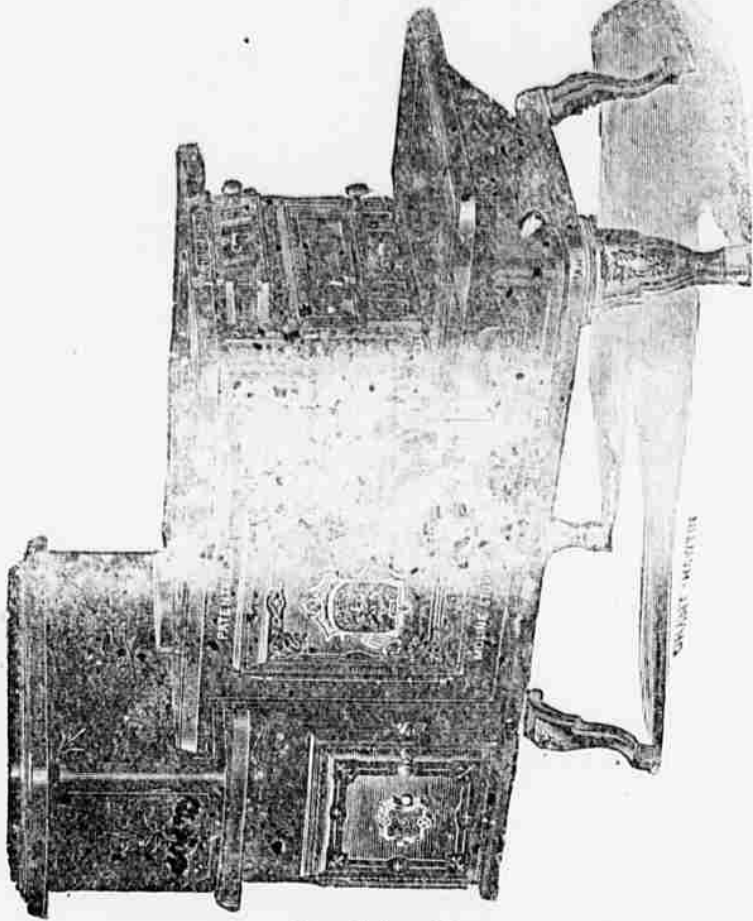

WEEDING WATER, July 9--This place has grown in the past year from 300 to 1,000 inhabitants, and still they come on the new Missouri Pacific railway, which is now fully completed and equipped, and runs four passenger trains and the same number of freight trains every twenty-four hours through here. It time would permit I could sum up a business done here that would surprise Omaha and Lincoln, and probably inflame the ire and envy of their speculators. Corn and hogs have been the chief commodities shipped this spring and summer, and Weeping Water may be appropriately termed the porkopolis of Cass county. To give an idea of the corn crop in this vicinity, I will state that there are four implement houses here doing a splendid business, and have sold and delivered over five hundred cultivators up to date. Of this number the firm of Rufner & Black have disposed of one hundred and ninety-six.

The "glorious Fourth" was celebrated in the most patriotic and pleasing manner. In the morning a large procession was formed, and headed by a band of music, marched to the city park. During the reading of the immortal declaration about four thousand persons in the meantime had congregated and crowded around the speaker's stand as best they could, to hear the oration delivered by Gen. C. H. Turner, of Hastings, in a most eloquent manner.

After dinner all kinds of innocent amusements were participated in--such as climbing the crossed poles, foot race, tub race, sack races, etc. (or trying to catch, as your correspondent was informed) the greased pig; also a mule race for a purse of \$100, gobbled up by Less Thomas with his favorite long-eared mule; a trotting match between D. D. Johnson, Esq., and Dr. Gibbon for \$200 was won by the latter. The fireworks in the evening was a grand display.

During the day heavy downpours kept up until about midnight, when all retired to the city hall, and there the elite of Weeping Water came on deck until daylight. General Turner and Hon. Orlando Telft engaged in this innocent amusement.

How Sutton Celebrated. The celebration at Sutton, an account of which was unavoidably delayed, was an immense success, there being nearly three thousand people present. The day was cool, cloudy and calm, so that the sun and dust, twin enemies of gala days, were not present to mar the occasion. The programme consisted mainly of prayer by Rev. Ewell; reading of Declaration by Prof. Pickering; oration, by Hon. John L. Caldwell, of Lincoln; dinner; oration, by Hon. James Laird, of Hastings; contraband of children, P. T. Walton in charge; dramatics; arms of Co. B, N. G., by Major Sweet; competitive base ball match between the Hastings nine and the Blue River nine, the former carrying away the prize of \$60, on the score of 32 to 7; target practice of Co. B, and a magnificent display of fireworks in the evening.

The very eloquent and excellent orations of Messrs. Caldwell and Laird were highly spoken of by all present as being far above the average of that kind of efforts, leaving lasting and favorable impressions.

There were over twenty schools present, including all the public schools of Sutton, in the line of march, with banners and tablets with appropriate mottoes, adding a new and pleasant feature to the occasion.

When the children sang "America" and "The Star Spangled Banner," the grand old hymn of Clark swayed in harmonious cadence.
