

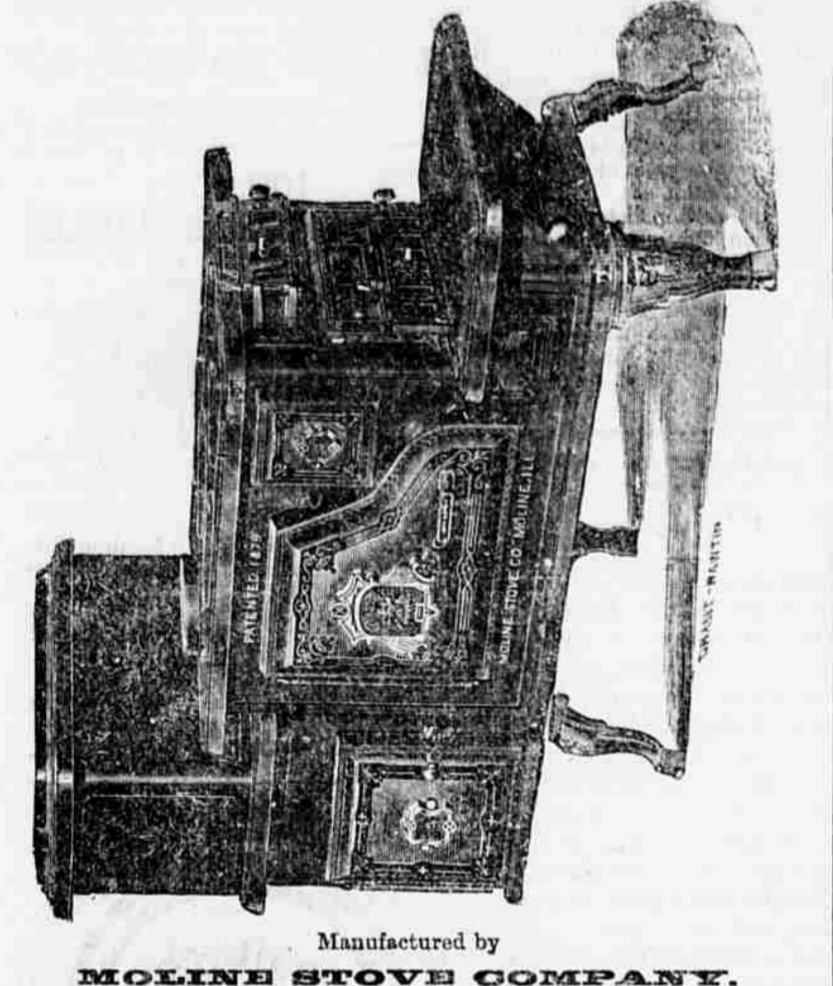

EUROPEAN ECHOES.

Naples is one of the harbors of refuge of the unfortunate Europeans who have been banished from Egypt by the stern mandate of war. No European the only victims. A great many Egyptians, some even pure blooded Arabs, have fled with them from the turmoil of Alexandria and Cairo.

It also adds a little interest to this strange migration that the ex-khedive, Ismail Pasha, who is indirectly the cause of all the trouble, lives at Naples, or rather just across the beautiful bay from the city. The ex-khedive's palace, called the Favorita, is built on a lava bed on the seashore, where the waves, which peacefully ebb and flow through the long, Neapolitan summer, sometimes dash and break with wild fury.

But not only at Naples is Ismail Pasha "at home." He has a residence at Rome also, and does there the honors of a host in truly royal fashion. The income of this retired monarch is not less than \$750,000 and may be \$1,000,000 a year, so that it is easy to conceive that he lives in state. Ismail knows everybody in Rome worth knowing, whether artists, politicians, diplomats or society people, and his dinners are reputed to be the finest given in the city. The ex-khedive's residence is the Villa Telfener, in the new quarter of the Maseo. Ismail is a short, stout person, some 60 years old, "with no oriental swarthyness or gaudiness in his manner, for he is as fair as an Anglo-Saxon."

The Russian crop outlook is satisfactory. Reports published as late as the 1st of this month show that in seven provinces—three in Portland, two in Western Russia and one on the Baltic—the yield of grain will be extraordinary. In twenty-three other provinces the production is up to the average, and in only limited areas, chiefly in the east and south, is partial or entire failure reported.

The singular British prejudice against American beef, it may be mentioned here, continues unabated. It is said to be impossible to find a butcher's shop in any part of London where foreign meat is sold for what it is. And yet the meat imported, alive and dressed, into Great Britain last year, was worth over \$100,000,000. The fresh beef trade has reached very great proportions, and is constantly expanding.

Rather more than the barren memory of a name accrues to Italy through the death of Garibaldi. The family have turned over to the nation the rocky island of Capraia, where he lived and died. This little speck of land in an ocean of water, just off the coast of Sardinia, is fifteen miles in circumference. The climate is temperate, or would be, but for prostrating winds from the African desert.

Summer came late in Paris this year and as usual gayety of the springtime was lacking. June was cold and rainy, the month almost duplicating the May of the United States. But with the advent of July there was heat enough. The Parisian does not know how to endure extreme heat or cold. 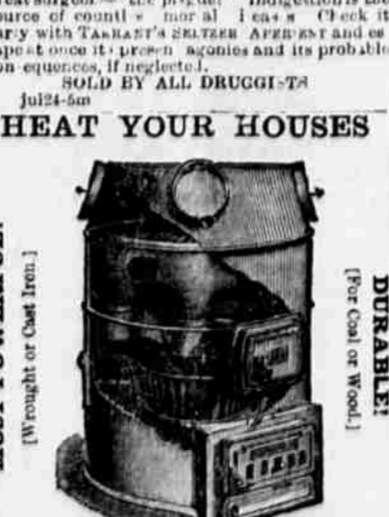

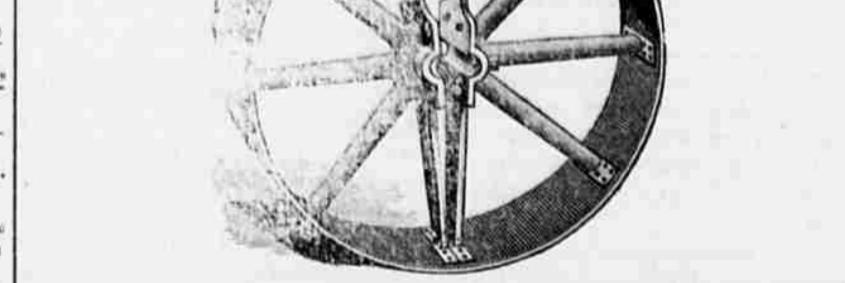
