FINANCIAL.

New York, August 4. Business for the past week was moderately active. The number of southern and western buyers in the market was larger than usual at this period of the year.

An impression has been industriously circulated that, owing to the strike of freight handlers, difficulty was anticipated in shipping goods by the trunk lines.

In grain, after a rapid decline in the latter part of last week, prices gradually advanced until Thursday, when they reached the highest rates.

Government bonds were unchanged for extended 5's, 4's and 4's coupons, and weak and 4 percent lower for extended 5's and 4's registered.

Railroad bonds were irregular on a fair volume of business. State securities were without feature.

The stock market opened less active than yesterday, prices fluctuated, and up to 1 o'clock lower prices ruled.

A feature of the transactions was the buying for investors of dividend paying advances. Chicago, Burlington & Quincy advanced to 137 1/2, Illinois Central to 141.

The transactions were 24,000 shares of St. Paul & Omaha, 7,000 Chicago, Burlington & Quincy, and 20,000 Kansas & Texas.
