

AHEAD OF THE WORLD.

The Big Business in Which Omaha Takes a Back Seat to No Place.

A Distributing Point for All the Eastern Manufacturers.

What Has Been Accomplished by the Linnear & Metcalf Agricultural Implement Company.

Among all the states of the union Nebraska stands pre-eminent for its agricultural resources and its facilities for communication with the trans-Mississippi territory from the Red River of the North to the Rio Grande.

A brief description of the buildings and contents will be of interest to this connection, though we would advise all who come to the city to go more than to verify the statements made above.

At the west side of the property and near the shipping platforms is a spacious office, equipped by the officers of the firm and also by two other representatives of eastern firms who have already secured desk and storage room.

The main warehouse consists of an L, in the south wing of which and on the first floor is the sample room for buggies.

Mr. Morrison plows, cultivators, Lansing wheel barrows, Newcomb grain register, etc., are in full stock, and a large space occupied by buggies, in which the house does so immense a trade that their stock seems amply fatuous in size.

On the ground floor of this wing the White Ford works several car loads of goods stored, and the Cleveland cooperative stoves also occupy considerable space.

It would be useless and tiresome to detail all the rooms or even the different warehouses connected with the company's property, for there is an immense base-cement floor of the whole building, a big storage warehouse to the east, and several outside buildings each as large as an ordinary wholesale house.

These are all fitted with heavy steel, barbed wire, mowers and reapers, etc. There are elevator connections with all parts of the building. A large quantity of telephone supplies and other things are stored in one of the rooms.

There is no doubt but that eastern manufacturers will appreciate the advantages offered, and that the Linnear, Metcalf Company will soon see their space filled, and a business that will justify the outlay and expense, and justify all their faith in the good judgment of the people of this section.
