

THE AGONY OVER.

The Last Session of the Woman Suffragists.

Gov. Hoyt and Judge Kingman, of Wyoming, and Misses Clay and Haggart Address the Meeting.

Thanks Tendered "The Bee" and Press Generally for Courtesies Extended.

The Officers and Platform Reported to the Convention.

The meeting Thursday was called to order by President Correll and prayer offered by Mrs. Dr. Thomas, of Indiana.

The audience was not so large as on the previous night, yet it was all the church would comfortably accommodate.

Miss Clay, daughter of Hon. Cassius M. Clay, of Kentucky, was the first speaker of the evening, and quoted and read extracts from the leading law journals of the day and other standard authorities, showing the gradual growth of a higher civilization and the liberal construction of statutory and constitutional law relative to woman and very briefly traced the progressive spirit that characterizes the 19th century.

At the close of this address Mrs. Mary E. Haggart, of Indiana, was introduced who, with her first sentence, riveted the attention of her audience. She took high ground and dealt with the question from a natural and rational stand point; said that natural right knows no sex; that women have souls as well as bodies; that society has a duty to perform toward them.

After the convention had attended to some financial matters, Miss Kate L. Kelsey, a dark-eyed brunette, of New Hampshire, and formerly of Wyoming, addressed the meeting in a most interesting and original manner.

During his speech a large number of questions were propounded him by the audience, which he answered with a fluency and ease that evinced a deep knowledge of the subject.

Resolutions were passed thanking the Bee and other papers for courtesies extended to the convention, and the president for his good management of the convention as its chairman and for his steadfast championship of the cause of woman suffrage.
