CORPSES PRESERVED.

A Discovery by Professor Scialzi, Medical Inspector at Rome. Some Letter to London Times. "Through the courtesy of Professor Scialzi, medical inspector of Santo Spirito, I had the opportunity of being present at the final examination of the body of a young man upon which Dr. Pietro Toniatti, of Verona, had experimented by the use of a liquid preparation he has discovered for the preservation of dead bodies, whether of men or animals, and the visible result was most surprising. The subject died on the 12th of last month—that is, nearly six weeks ago—of cancer of the lungs, and the liquid was injected thirty-six hours after death. On the 8th inst.—i. e., twenty-six days later—the ordinary wooden coffin was opened in the presence of Professor Scialzi, representing on the occasion the minister of public instruction. Dr. Postempki, demonstrator of clinical surgery in the Roman university, Dr. Hretti, army surgeon, and others, and the body was found in a perfect state of preservation and flexibility and presenting the appearance of one that had only been dead a few hours. The cranium, thorax and abdomen were then opened, and the brain, lungs, heart and viscera, of which were found to be in a perfectly well preserved and healthy state, when removed. The operations completed and the process verbal signed, the body, brains and intestines were set apart for a continued test of time which expired on Wednesday. On entering the operating room I was unable to detect any offensive odor. The arms and legs and other parts I felt were cool and warm. The absence of rigidity, and the complete normal condition of recent death. Previous to the body being confined for interment, one leg and one arm were taken off for further preservation and examination, incisions were made and pieces were removed for microscopic examination, and everywhere the normal colors and were perfectly fresh and sweet. The brain, lungs and liver, which were on a table apart, had at first sight a very unpromising appearance. They were completely covered with a coating of green mould, and might have been mistaken for lumps of old bronze, but on being cut across they were found to be in a perfect state of preservation. The condition of the brain was most remarkable. It had undergone no alteration whatever. The white and gray substances and all the convolutions were as distinct as if it had only just been removed from the cranium. In addition to the commission named by the minister of public instruction through Toninetti's discovery, in the anatomical schools of the kingdom and in other ways connected with the medical and chemical sciences, the ministers of the army and navy have appointed others to consider what use can be made of it in connection with their commissariat departments. Experiments that have been made on the bodies of animals with equal success tend to prove that the discovery may be of great utility for elementary purposes, and especially in the preservation of a perfectly fresh state of carcasses of meat for exportation to great distances. As regards the liquid Dr. Toniatti declines for the present to state of what materials it is composed of. He states, however, that it is perfectly innocuous and its presence imperceptible, and in proof of its harmlessness drank, I am told, a tumbler of it when in Rome last month before proceeding to inject the body.

Whaling Curiosities. For a month past Mr. James Temple Brown, assistant of the United States National museum, connected with the Smithsonian institute in Washington, has been in New Bedford collecting curiosities and pharmaceuticals of whaling traffic, which are to be added to a small exhibit recently located there. Mr. Brown has been very successful, and has received valuable assistance from ship-owners and captains, many of whom have given articles which cannot be duplicated. The fact that some of the rarest specimens of harpoons, etc., were found in junk shops indicate how soon they would have passed out of existence entirely. Even at the present time it has been impossible to complete a series of harpoons, although some fifteen varieties have been found. No article connected with the business has been despised by Mr. Brown on account of its non-importance, and he has collected everything, from the historical "pigtail" tobacco supplied to the sailors to a fully-equipped whalboat. The hook to a large hook with a hoisting blubber from a whale would not seem of much value, but with it Mr. Brown proposes to convey to the intellect of persons unacquainted with the "monarch of the seas" some idea of the size of the whale, for the hook was broken in hoisting a piece of blubber of unusual weight. A huge boat-davit of the ordinary pattern, broken by a heavy sea, illustrates the force of the billow. The ingenuity of the whaler man is exemplified by a lamp made from an ordinary tumbler, to which is fastened a top and a burner, a butter-knife made from ivory, a ditty-box containing needles, thread, etc., and even a spit-box, made aboard ship, figures in the collection. A boarding-knife, improvised from a cutlass, the knife used in cutting the ambergris from the whale taken by bark Adeline Gibbs, a boot-jack, a frog preserved in molasses, logbooks and charts, a throat-chain weighing 119 pounds, a whaling-gun which has broken two collar bones by the force of its recoil, are included on account of their associations. Among the more valuable articles collected are bombguns and lances of every variety, many of them new.
