REVOLUTION IN IRON.

A Process in the Manufacture of Iron Which Will Dispense With Puddiing.

it sburg Special Di patch to the Chicago Tri-A movement is on foot in Wheeling to utterly revolutionize the iron men-ufacturing business of that city and of the whole country. The enterprise of the iron and nail manufacturers there is to do entirely away with puddling, puddlers, and, of course, puddlers' strikes. A syndicate was formed in Wheeling, the scene of the recent troublesome strike, to carry out this idea. They have held a series of starchamber sessions, the result of which has been the sending of one of Wheeling's most prominent mill-managers, Frank J. Hearne, to this city to ar range the preliminaries for putting the plan in operation. The gentleman was interviewed yesterday, and, after some persuasion, he gave the append-

To do away with puddling, the only method to be pursued by the syndicate is to use a low grade of open hearth or Bessemer steel in making nails. This movement has been started by the nail manufacturers of Wheeling, and my object in being in this city is to further their plain. I have had numerous blows of soft steel made at the Bessemer steel works at Braddock's and each blow accurately analyzed. This soft steel has been made into nail plate and quietly slipped into the Wheeling mills, and cut into nails, without the nailers being able to discover the difference between it and common nail iron. Our reason for doing this was to see whether steel would make nails. The results of our experiments have been entirely satisfactory, and we are now satisfied that we can make nails out of soft steel cheaper and of a better quality for their weight than it was possible to do with the best puddled iron. We calculate in Wheeling that we make about one seventh of the nails made in the United States. nails. These will all be thrown out of employment unless they see fit to work at some other branch of labor. 
