THE VALENTINE CRAZE.

Yearly Increasing in Virulence and its Victims Multiplying.

Costly Valentines in Greater Demand This Year.

Fernando Wood's and Roscoe Conkling's enterprise in the Valentine Line.

Statistics do not support the assertion that the festival of St. Valentine is degenerating. New York has for a long period enjoyed a monopoly in the valentine trade, the firm of Forner & Fisher having the proud distinction of taking the initiative step in their manufacture.

At the present time three local firms issue nine tenths of these little tokens, which find their way to all parts of the globe, and even to New Jersey. They can be made very expensive, but this mainly depends upon the size and contents of the purchaser's wallet, and the value placed upon the object of adoration.

One of the largest manufacturers, W. J. A. Lieder, of 60 Chatham street, yesterday informed a Journal reporter that the yearly sales of the (alleged) "comic" valentines exceeded by far the combined orders for all other varieties.

Valentines retailing for over \$20 are not kept in stock, since they are seldom called for, but orders for more expensive varieties are by no means uncommon. Mr. Lieder has now on hand several ranging from \$25 to \$75. These when completed will bear but little resemblance to the "every-day valentine" to be seen in store windows.

As a matter of fact, however, the valentines making the largest sale among the gilt-edge and lace-paper variety are those which affect the pocket the least—from five to twenty-five cents being about the limit of human credulity.

The most extensive manufactory in the country is located at No. 49 Atlantic avenue, Brooklyn, where about fifty hands, chiefly composed of young ladies, are always employed the year round. They evince undoubted experience in fashioning sundry bits of paper into a perfect and beautiful picture, and are well paid in return.

INDUSTRIAL NOTES.

A rolling mill is to be built at Grove City, Mercer county, Pa.

The New Era Manufacturing company of Chicago has been incorporated, with a capital of \$5,000.

The Kestor Lumber company of Mohline, Ill., cut 20,000,000 feet of lumber during the past season.

The hard-ware works of Duggan & Hart, 855 Levee, were destroyed by fire January 15. The loss was \$10,000.

Davenport, Iowa, is to have an extensive new flouring mill, with a capital of \$80,000 for its erection and operation.

There are eighty-six firms engaged in the manufacture of petroleum in this country. The aggregate capital used is over \$2,750,746.

The Philadelphia bridge works at Patterson have turned out an average of 1,000,000 pounds of iron per month for the past year.

Faribault, Minn., has \$300,000 invested in the milling industry. The mills all use the roller system, and all are running to their full capacity.

Work on the "Nickel Plate" shops at Stony Island progressed rapidly, notwithstanding the bad weather. They are nearly completed.

The Pennsylvania Steel company of Harrisburg are building a school building at Steelton, to cost \$25,000, to be used for the children of the workmen.

A company has been formed at Galveston to build an iron pier two miles to deep water, to increase the wharf facilities. The improvement will cost \$1,000,000.

The total value of products of the manufacturing industries of Portland, Oregon, for the year 1884 was \$7,434,900. The population of the city is less than 35,000.

The Marshall town canning company has shipped up to December 10 about eighty car loads of canned goods, which amount to most of their products for the season.

The forge and bolt departments of the Elba Iron works, at Frankstown, Pa., near Pittsburg, were destroyed by fire on January 15. The loss was over \$40,000; nearly lost.

At the Washburn iron company's works, Terra Haute, Indiana, recently, the eight-inch guide mill, with one heating furnace, in eight hours, turned out 31,938 pounds of finished iron in one day.

The value of products of the manufacturing industries of Toledo, Ohio, for the year 1884 was \$18,500,000. The value of the additions to the various industries during the year was \$340,000.

The government of Venezuela decrees that machinery intended for exhibition at Caracas in 1878, at the centennial celebration of the independence of that country, shall be admitted at Loguira free of duty.

The extensive clothing manufacturing establishment of Messrs. Friend Bros., in Milwaukee, Wis., was destroyed by fire January 1, involving a loss of over \$500,000, of which there was an insurance of \$378,000.

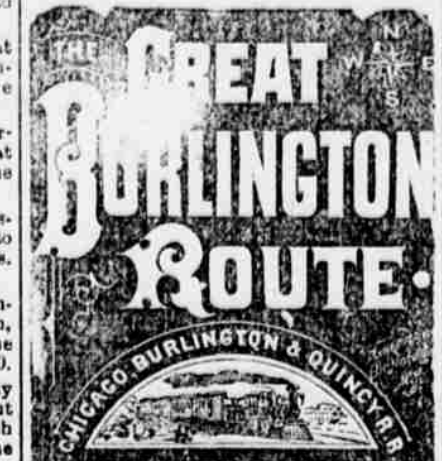
