Centerville is talking street railroad. A fire company has been organized at Spencer. A gramin sugar factory is proposed at B. Plains. There is likely to be a savings bank started at LeMars. The machinery has been bought for a broom factory at Onawa. The site for a \$12,000 school house has been bought at Marshalltown. A colony of Germans direct from the old country have located near Denison. The Clinton county grand jury has condemned the jail at DeWitt as unsafe and unhealthy. Davenport claims 300 new houses and 200 new inhabitants within the past twelve months. The government building at Des Moines is to be made four stories high and otherwise bettered \$85,000 worth. The state agricultural college at Ames has bought a \$100 Jersey calf. Fred Holt, of Boone, was the lucky seller. The city engineer of Dubuque says that sewers on the Warring system can be put in for \$1 to \$1.25 per lineal foot. The Ottumwa police are arresting men and boys who get on and off moving trains. It is proposed to break up the practice. The city library building at Creston will cost about \$15,000. The Burlington railroad company assists the city to put up the edifice.

#### AMERICA'S TALLEST MAN.

A Texas Farmer Who Stands Nearly Eight Feet High in No. 15 Boots.

White Oak Letter in the New Orleans Democrat. Being at the house of Mr. Franklin, in Titus county, mention was made of the Texas giant, and I learned that he was a near neighbor of my host. #### PALEADER ON THE HUDSON

is almost reproduced here. Half way through the canyon the Gannison turns into a still deeper gorge to the right, and the road continues by the side of Cimarron creek, which leads to where the cliffs are more rugged still, and whose sides are filled with ceding vines and stunted pines and cedars. The region becomes darker and gloomier, while the creek flows over its rocky bed and among granite boulders with a rumble that fills the gorge with deafening echoes. The natural difficulties in the way of construction were lighter thereafter. The Cedar Divide is crossed by a series of steep grades, and thence the line descends to Montrose, in the Uncomphage Valley, the richest part of the Ute Reservation. The Ouray extension will be built from this point. Following the Uncomphage, after leaving Montrose, the road traverses a valley filled with rich farm land to Delta. Here again the Gannison River is encountered, and the road follows it through its yellow lined canyon to Grand Junction, the extreme western city of the State, built at the head of Grand Valley. A wide neck of land runs westward from it between two long lines of cliffs, and watered by the River Grand, is capable of producing EVERY VARIETY OF FRUIT AND CEREAL.

of Fort Dodge has sent a man to Chicago to buy machinery. A site for the works will be bought, and contracts let for the buildings as soon. A firm in Des Moines sought to get out an injunction restraining the telephone company from putting up a pole in front of their place of business. The circuit court declines to grant the injunction. Creston's saloon license is \$1,000, Ottumwa \$1,000, Sioux City \$800, Keokuk \$300, Cedar Rapids \$250, Davenport \$200, Council Bluffs \$100, Dubuque \$75, and Marshalltown nothing. Rock Rapids needs a tow mill, a paper mill, a fire department, a liberal club organization, a brick yard, a coal mine, an artificial well for invalids, a public hall, marble works, etc., and by your paid moon she will have them, too. The Dubuque Motor company has been reorganized, and promises a vigorous campaign. This is in the company that built a railway from Dubuque to the bluffs back of the business part of the town, the same to be operated by dummy engines. The German Methodists of LeMars worshiped the second story of a building. During the services last Sunday evening the flash of a rifle fire outside raised the alarm of fire, and only the prompt action of a few devoted worshippers prevented a disastrous panic. The Wall Lake ma had arrested some boys who were fighting. The mother of one of the youngsters and an attorney intercepted the marshal and his prisoners en route to the jail. The attorney was so emphatic in his arguments of a habeas corpus motion that the marshal conducted him before the mayor to answer the charge of carrying concealed weapons.

#### HEART OF THE WASATCH MOUNTAINS

and was formed by two immense towers of red sandstone which have a sheer descent of nearly 500 feet, and are several offshoots from the cliffs behind them. They are so close to each other as barely to allow the passage of the road and the stream. Once through the narrow way, and climbing the steep grades of Price River Canyon, the road follows first one stream and then another, and all the while there are unbroken forests, vari-colored rocks, clear waters, green meadows, tangled brush and vistas of distant, snowy peaks. At Soldier divide, on the very top of the range, the road takes its eagle-like plunge down the western slope, and after emerging from the various gorges encountered, enters Utah Valley and is almost WITHIN SIGHT OF SALT LAKE CITY.
