The annual report of the Chief Engineer of the Omaha Fire Department was received and referred to the committee on fire printing.

BOARD OF EDUCATION. Regular Monthly Meeting Last Evening.

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Education was held Monday evening, all the members being present. The treasurer's report showed the fines and licenses collected for April to be \$799.50; taxes collected, \$2,765.17; balance on hand, \$25,032.02.

The finance committee reported the purchase of \$1600 paying bonds at par and their action was approved. This is done with the money in the sinking fund. The balance of the June pay roll was approved. In the contracts with Henry Kosters, Bailey and Olsen and A. W. Phelps, for work, it was decided to require no bond.
