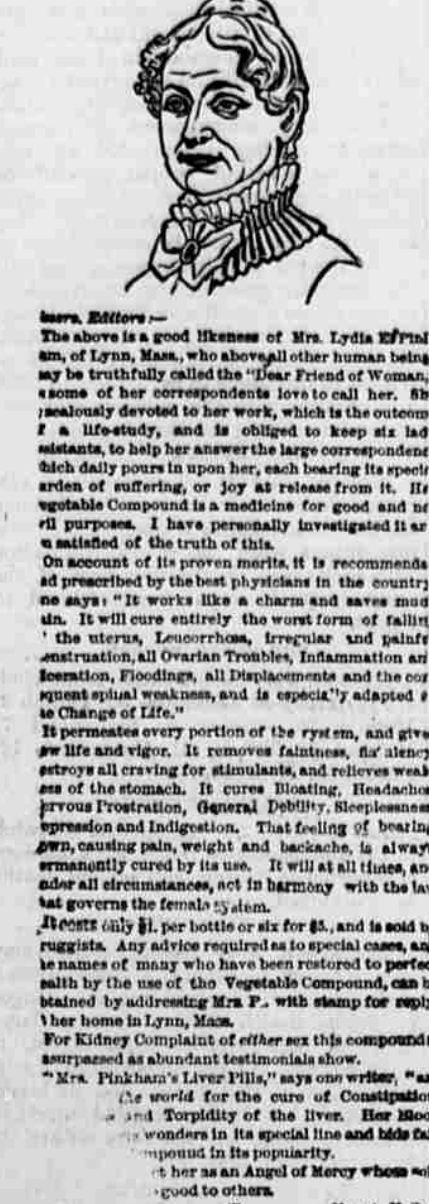

For five mortal hours a sort of third mate was stationed in the starboard gangway, and he drawled out:

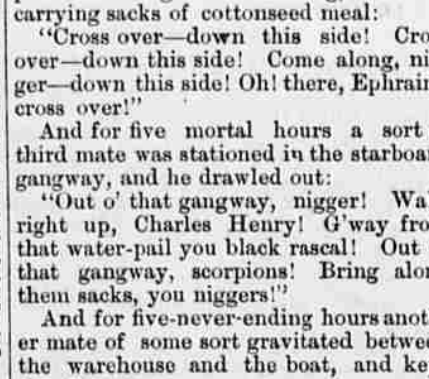
