HOMEWARD BOUND. A Parting Glance at Valentine, the Growing Metropolis of Cherry County.

Valentine, Neb., July 28. Upon returning here from the Rosebud Agency, after an absence of about a week, I was astonished to see six new frame buildings put up on the main street for business, and several dwelling houses, all of which were not there when I left. This is the way these little western towns grow; as fast as the lumber can be had, as fast as the carpenters obtainable can work.

Valentine is the landing place for all of the ANNUITY GOODS and supplies which the Interior department sends out to the Pine Ridge and the Rosebud Indian agencies. From the depot here the goods are transported in wagons, the Indians being paid fifty cents a hundred for freighting to Rosebud and a dollar a hundred to Pine Ridge.

is the "Cherry county bank," an institution very much needed and the only one in the county. It is established by Sparks, Bros. & Co., and is calculated to transact a general banking business. Mr. A. Sparks has also a general store which has a very extensive trade.

is beautifully located just over the Niobrara river, near the point where Minnehachusa empties into it. It is a remarkably well kept place, everything in perfect order, the houses and grounds all looking neatly. Col. E. Y. Sumner is the commanding officer, and maintains a rigid discipline. In the first of the adobe houses of the officers I found Lieut. Thomas and wife, well known to Omaha people. Lieut. Maconb, who lives next door, is also pretty well acquainted at headquarters.

The land there is everywhere excellent. The climate is delightful; the nights always cool, no matter how warm the days. Water is abundant and trees grow without any trouble. From Neligh to Blair there is one constant succession of fields of fine, light corn. Above Neligh farms are not so frequent, and are further from the railroad. But at the present rate of emigration the whole will be settled up soon, and the mammoth counties, states in themselves, will have to be divided. The Elkhorn valley will blossom like a rose.
