The Condition of the People Terrible and Heartrending—The Death Roll. GUAYMAS, Mex., September 18.—There was a copious rain last night, clearing the atmosphere and bringing the thermometer to 84°. The people look upon it as the greatest blessing that could have happened, as it will prevent the spread of fever. Eight deaths are reported to-day. The prefect of Hernandez issued orders that no bodies be buried until pronounced dead by a physician, then to be retained in the dead house three hours before interment. Quite a number of Americans and foreigners have died. At present it is impossible to learn the names of those who apply for relief.
