SPRINGFIELD, Mass., November 30.—Frederick Armstrong, a prominent citizen of the town of Orange, Mass., was killed yesterday morning by the accidental discharge of C. A. Bullard's gun while fox hunting.

MACOB, Ga., November 30.—A train from Macon to Savannah killed two negroes, Williams and May, yesterday. The bodies were terribly mutilated.

CHICAGO, November 30.—The Daily News, Dixon, Ill., special says: Jas. L. Camp, appointed postmaster of Dixon by President Lincoln in 1861, and holding that office ever since, died from a stroke of paralysis in church yesterday.

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BOSTON, November 30.—Rev. Warren H. Cudworth, pastor of the church of our Saviour, Unitarian, East Boston, dropped dead while taking part at the union Thanksgiving service at Maverick church.

INDIANAPOLIS, November 30.—Professor Samuel K. Heshour, a distinguished educator of Indiana, died yesterday, aged 80 years.
